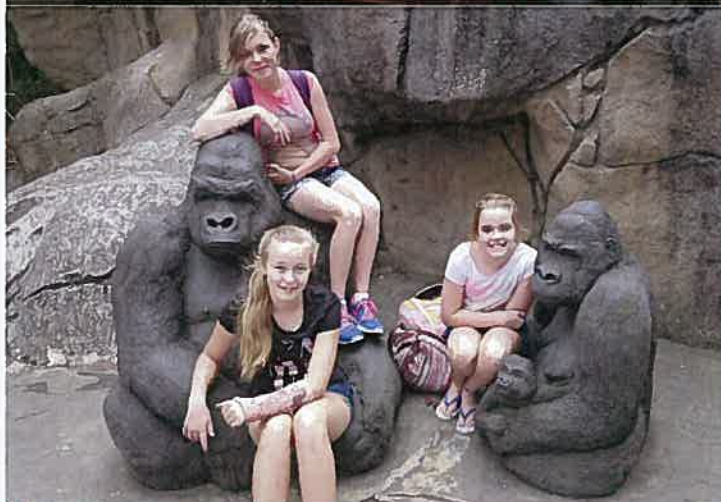

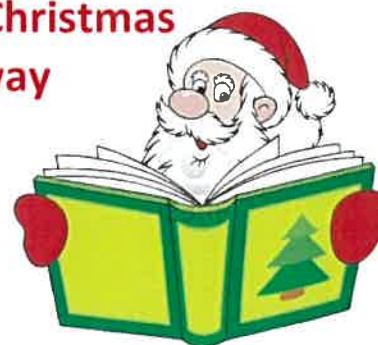

We have also introduced freshly squeezed juice, this week is watermelon and kiwi fruit!

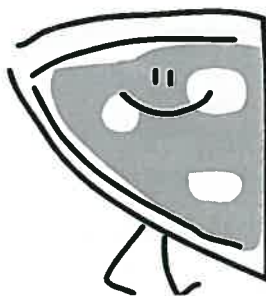
