Principal's Report

Excursions We find ourselves once again thanking Miss Goldthorpe for her extra work with students. Last week, Thursday to Sunday, she took the cattle show team to Scone for the Beef Bonanza. Bubba our young steer has been the focus of the program and the 5 students involved all received valuable experience from the event. These are the sort of things which students always remember and where they seem to be switched on and receptive to the opportunity. Thanks Miss Goldthorpe and also a huge thank you to Mrs Hughes from Condobolin High School.



Later this week Mr West and Miss Ward are taking the secondary students to Jindabyne with our friends and colleagues from Lake Cargelligo. Once again I feel sure the students will benefit greatly from this event. Thanks to parents for their promptness with payment and permission for their students to attend. The school's support and efficient fundraising have reduced costs. This will also be

the case with the primary excursion to Canberra. Please monitor students' bag packing and remind them to take sunscreen and a hat.

Computer and Video Conferencing improvements. The holidays saw an upgrade to the Video Conferencing facilities. Our involvement in the Lachlan Access Program is valuable for our senior students in terms of the facilities which support their learning. I had the pleasure of sitting in on a senior VC lesson yesterday and I was hugely impressed by the preparation which the teacher had done to support the lesson. Great work.

Mr Fyfe and Mr Small have also begun upgrading the computer facilities in the classroom within the TAS block. These desktop machines have better specifications than the notebook machines which students have been using. There are a couple of points I want to make clear. Students at TCS have significant access to Information Technologies at school. However, students don't own the computers which the school provides. They should make a habit of saving their work onto their USBs. In this way they can continue with their work if they need to use another machine. The other outcome of this improvement is that students in 7 and 8 should not assume that the TAS classroom is their "homeroom". They will be required to use an alternate classroom should the desktop machines in this room be needed for another group. Thanks to Mr Small and Mr Fyfe for the extra work this innovation has required. Our school is among the 70% of schools who have not embraced a Bring Your Own Device program. Students who wish to bring their own device may after negotiation but there is no need to.



Hosting a foreign exchange student

Elsewhere in the newsletter is a blurb about hosting an exchange student. The group involved are trying to place some exchange students from Italy. My limited understanding tells me that foreign exchange is one of the most challenging and rewarding experiences possible. Many years ago we hosted a boy from Japan. Nao (pronounced Now) was amazed by the space in Australia – at that time we lived in Lithgow. He took over a term to feel like he could speak and understand English, which was a big challenge to him. We remain friends with Nao who is in his 30s.

Imagine the experience living in Tullibigeal would provide for an Italian child. Far more interesting than Sydney or Melbourne. I expect food would be an out of pocket expense for the host family but I would thoroughly support the experience. Refer to the page elsewhere in the newsletter if you are interested.

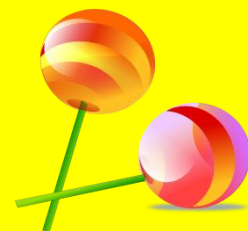

Important Information

Whooping cough information for schools

There is an outbreak of whooping cough (pertussis) in NSW, mainly affecting school-aged children.

Coughing spreads the infection to others nearby. Whooping cough can spread to anyone at home, including younger brothers and sisters. Whooping cough can be especially dangerous for babies.

Whooping cough starts like a cold and progresses to bouts of coughing that can last for many weeks. The infection can occur even in fully-vaccinated children. Older children may just have a cough that is persistent and may be worse at night.

- Children with these symptoms should see a doctor.
- If your doctor diagnoses whooping cough in your school-aged child, please let the school know and keep your child at home until they have taken 5 days of antibiotics. Keep coughing children away from babies.
- Whooping cough vaccines give good protection against infection but immunity fades with time. Check that all your children are up to date with their vaccines, due at 6 weeks, 4 months, 6 months, 4 years and 12 years of age (offered to all Year 7 students through the NSW school-based vaccination

program). A booster is also recommended at 18 months of age.

A booster dose of vaccine is also recommended for adults that are in contact with young children, such as school staff and parents. Pregnant women are recommended to have a booster dose during each pregnancy and this is funded by NSW Health. Those who are new parents or carers of babies should consult their general practitioner about appropriate immunisation.

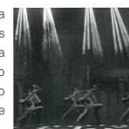

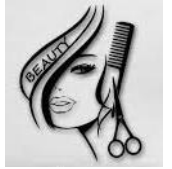

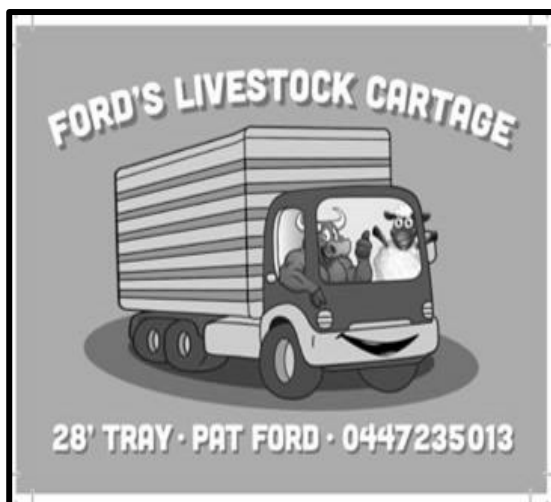
