Secondary Snowy Mountains Excursion

Last week TCS secondary students along with Mr West and Miss Ward joined with staff and students from Lake Cargelligo Central School for an excursion to the Snowy Mountains to learn about and observe fragile ecosystems and the hydro-electric scheme. We visited Yarrangobilly Caves and walked about 400m inside, through some very narrow passages and steep steps. Everyone noticed the sudden drop in temperature – the caves maintain a temperature of approximately 11degrees all year round.

Day two was the big climb up to the top of Mount Kosciuszko – Australia's highest point. We took a 2km chair lift up from Thredbo and from there we faced a 14km round trip to the summit. This involved some steep inclines and a number of sections where the path was completely buried under snow! Despite the snow we were lucky to climb on an unusually warm day and it was not that cold. Once we reached the top we enjoyed lunch atop the summit.

On the third day we headed home via the Snowy Hydro education centre at Cooma which provided some insight into how the hydroelectric power plants were built and how they work. Canberra was our final stop, with a visit to the Australian War Memorial before heading home.

Thank you to students for your excellent behaviour on the trip and to parents for supporting the excursion.






