Principal's Report

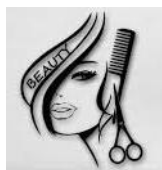

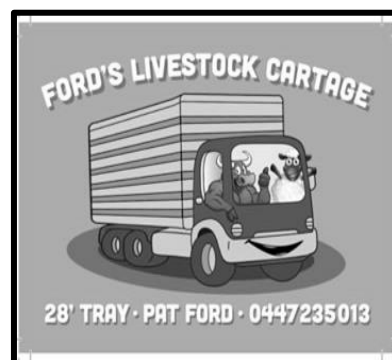

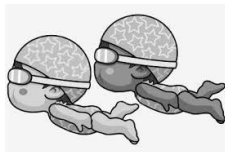
