## Principal's Report

Both days run from 9am to 3.45pm. You may train in your RSA and RCG at any age – even under 18 years old. You may NOT serve alcohol even if you have your RSA competency card if you are under 18.**



**Literacy and Numeracy Tests/Stage 5 and 6.** I enquired about fellows in Year 10 doing these tests even though they are expecting to return to school in 2016. I received the following advice from the board.

The tests are for older students who are thinking about leaving school. There is a Demonstration Test that anyone can do, it gives users the look and feel of the tests. No log-in is required.

For assessment/psychometric purposes, three months must elapse between attempts at the tests. The tests can be sat twice a year in each of Year 10, 11 and 12.

Looks like a good idea for the agenda in weeks 9 and 10.

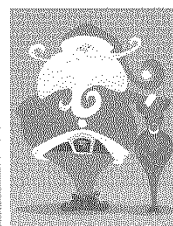

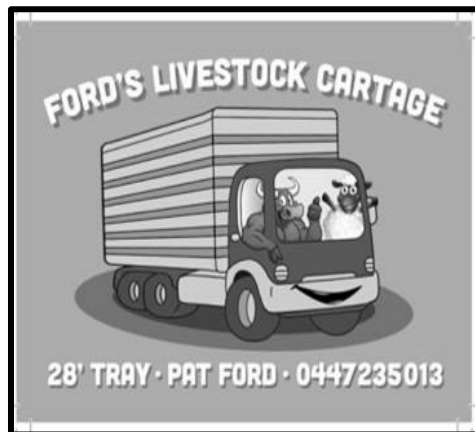

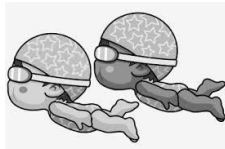
