CYCA Youth Sailing Program

Last week three students from TCS travelled to Rushcutters Bay in Sydney to participate in the Cruising Yacht Club of Australia's Youth Sailing Program. 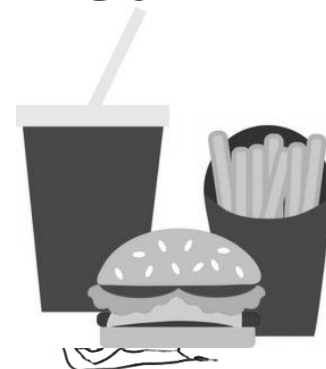

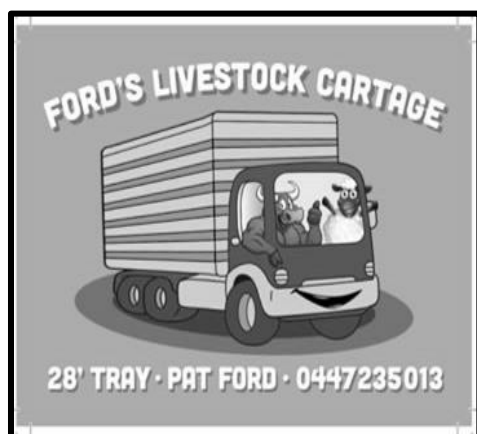

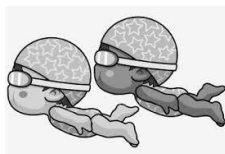
