Principal's Report

Condo youth keen to get under the bonnet

It is not quite as glamorous as the Australian Grand Prix, but taking car engines apart and playing with lawn mowers is keeping a growing number of Lachlan Shire teenagers entertained – all while teaching them some valuable vocational skills.

For the first time ever, Condobolin's TAFE Western is running the Automotive Light Vehicle TVET class for high school students.

There are now seventeen students enrolled in the course and the TAFE has had to roster on a second teacher to support the demand.

"It is a big class," said teacher Kris Trgo, who started with the students last week. "That's why I am here, to help Jeremy [Reid]."

"It covers pretty much everything from someone who knows nothing about cars – so this is a spanner, this is a screwdriver – right through to the details of how an engine works."

TAFE-delivered Vocational Education and Training (TVET) courses are run through TAFE but count as a high school subject.

"They are loving it," said Condobolin High School Careers Advisor, Lindy Moon. "They had a ride-on lawn mower [to work on] last week. They had a small engine they were working on and they have pulled apart a ute already and it has only been three weeks!"

"Years ago, they used to do it and travel to Forbes," she said, "but it has never been run before in Condo."

The class runs each Wednesday from 10am until 2pm for the next three terms. Last Wednesday, they spent the lesson trying to repair a ute's engine and examining the workings of a lawn mower.

"We try to give them a taste of everything that they might encounter," Mr Trgo explained.

As well as seven Year 10 and Year 11 students from Condobolin High School, four students from Tullibigeal and four from Ungarie travel to Condobolin to take part in the course.

The students have received funding from the Department of Education through the regional VET organisation to be able to do the course.

Barrick Gold has also funded steel cap boots for the students.

All TAFE fees will be passed onto students if they choose to complete a TAFE course.

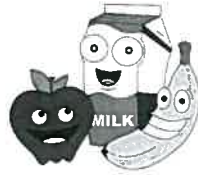

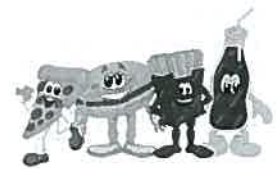
