## Principal's Report

### Anzac Commemorations

Saturday 25th April went extremely well by all accounts. I need to again thank Jacqui Dillon for covering for me while I was in Sydney. I have seen many photos of the day which impressed me greatly. The senior students did remarkably well running the scripted section of the day. The children who laid poppies were part of an attractive and moving component of the program. Students read their poems which connected them in a real way. It was also wonderful that we were able to have to soldiers from Kapooka, Lieutenant Kirkham and Corporal Mark to attend our special service, as it was our first service with our Memorial completely finished.

The fact that over half the students of the school attended and their uniform was so well worn is a tribute to the kids, their parents and the town.

**Kate McGown** is visiting again this year and is working with students from Years 5-8 this week in preparation for the launch of the PATHs program I will be most intrigued to visit some lessons and understand her message more clearly. Tullibigeal was lucky to be selected to be part of the trial and will later host the launch of PATHs in week 7.

### **Resilience**

Respect, Responsibility and Resilience are our 3 *Positive Behaviour for Learning* values. By way of strengthening their place in the life of the school, we have renamed our raffle tickets after these 3 values. When teachers notice a student modelling one or more of these values they can write them a raffle ticket which may win them a small prize in our fortnightly draw.

The school intends to soon organise a weekend in-service for staff on the *Resilience Donut* which is a program run in many schools to build student resilience. I will check to be sure, but I believe parents would be welcome to attend. More on this later.

Another initiative which addresses the notion of resilience comes from the *Black Dog Institute*. This organisation's efforts are aimed at mental health and they have developed some online instruction which we will use at school with Secondary and Upper Primary students. ### **Naplan**

Tests will be conducted in week 4 for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. They will examine aspects of both Literacy and Numeracy. They occur on May 12, 13 and 14, with a catch up day on Friday 15 May for tests which have been missed. Students will do these in the 3-6 room. Secondary students are reminded that, the numeracy component for them contains both a calculator section and a non-calculator section; so they need to have a calculator and be familiar with it.

### **Learning Planning Meetings**

Our first round of Learning Planning Meetings are occurring next Thursday 7 May. Thanks to Jan for organising the time. We hope to be having many more by the end of term.

### **Work Experience**

After a couple of requests we are expecting to have a Work Experience week in Week 7 of this term, 1<sup>st</sup> June to 5<sup>th</sup> June. It will be for students in Years 9 and 10. We would be keen for boys and girls to organise their own placement. Remember it could be anywhere, so if they have an Aunty in Melbourne to stay with they may be able to secure work there for the week. Students should feel free to discuss work placement ideas with a staff member if they are unsure where they might start. Students who are lucky enough to live on a farm should look for a placement somewhere else other than at home.

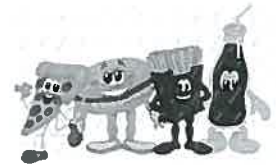

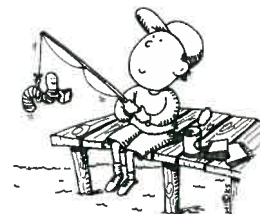
