STAGE 4 HISTORY

This term in Stage 4 HSIE we have been learning about ancient history. Our term began with exploring the topic of history itself, discovering how historians and archaeologists learn about our past. Students were then given an inquiry based task of investigating a 4000 year old murder victim whose body was discovered by accident in northern Sydney when building a bus shelter in 1991. Through investigation of the geography of the land and spear wounds discovered on the bones, students were able to draw conclusions as to how and why the man had met his fate.

In more recent weeks we have started our focus study on ancient Greece, starting with a look at the many different gods that were believed in and the different roles each one played. Students completed posters in class to showcase their chosen god including their powers and responsibilities, where they fit in the family tree, the symbols representing the god and an example of where the god featured in a story/legend. Some of these posters are featured below.

Goddess of love

Interesting facts

- There is no account of Aphrodite as a child and she is always depicted as being born as a fully developed woman.
- Aphrodite is married to Hephaestus.
- She is the god of love and beauty.
- Aphrodite means "out of foam."
- Aphrodite was formed in the sea.

Aphrodite is a daughter of Zeus and the Oceanic Nymphs Dione. Aphrodite and Dionysus both had temples in the sanctuary of Zeus at Dodona.

Athena was the protector of Athens, the virgin goddess of war and wisdom, and the patroness of the arts and crafts.

Family relations

Her siblings were Ares, Hephaestus, Apollo, Artemis and her parents were Zeus and Hera. She was born from Hera's head.

The birth of Athena

After a time, Zeus developed an unbearable headache, which made him scream out of pain so loudly it could be heard throughout the earth. The other gods came to see what the problem was. Hermes said that what needed to be done and directed Hephaestus to take a wedge and split open Zeus's skull. Out of the skull sprang Athena, fully grown and in a full set of armour. Due to the way of her birth, she became the goddess of intelligence and wisdom.

Interesting facts

Athena was the favourite daughter of Zeus. Athena raised a baby born from the earth.



Poseidon (Po-sigh-don)

Poseidon controlled the sea.

My gods symbols is the trident, horse and a dolphin.

Poseidon was the second son of titans Cronus and Rhea. In most accounts he is swallowed by Cronus at birth but later saved, with his other brothers and sisters, by Zeus. However, in some versions of the story, he, like his brother Zeus, did not share the fate of his other brother and sisters who were eaten by Cronus.

Interesting facts: Wherever Poseidon goes, he rides in a gold chariot drawn by two white horses with gold manes and brass hooves. He is creative, designing all the creatures in the sea. Poseidon is second only to Zeus in power among the gods, and he represents Zeus having the greater power.

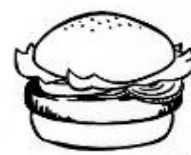

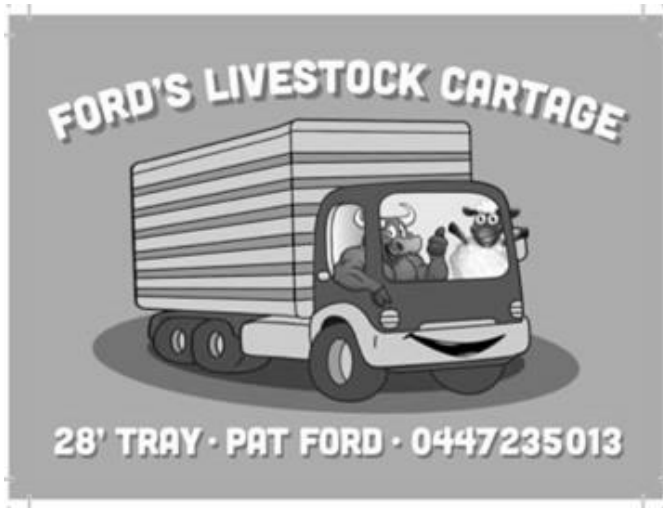
