- Bike safety knowledge and riding skills as part of PDHPE



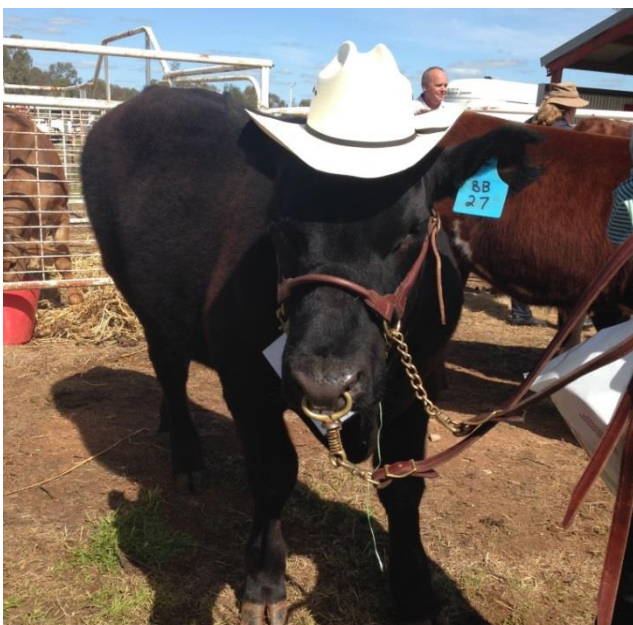
- View bike safety messages within our school community

“LAND OF THE RIPPLING GOLD”, (a book based on the early years of Tullibigeal).

“Land of the Rippling Gold” was written by Una Clarke. Her father Sydney Field was one of the early agents in Tullibigeal in the Late 1920’s. Una grew up in Tullibigeal, along with her parents and older sister and one younger brother, during the depression, drought and hard times.

Written as a novel, the book is based on her family’s life in Tullibigeal. The events in the book actually happened and the characters are the actual people who lived here, (only the names have been changed). On the cover and throughout the book’s 131 pages are photographs taken in Tullibigeal during the early 1930’s. The book is easy to read and a great insight into how tough life was for those who settled here during that time.
