Principal's Report

Best Start Last week Mrs Dillon completed the Best Start assessments of Kindergarten students. Each child has their own path to learning. The Best Start assessments rate students against criteria and give parents ideas to progress their child from where they are. Can I recommend you take time to look them over and see what is recommended as the next steps for your young person? Contact the school if you have any queries about all this.

Seniors Meeting We have a meeting with parents and students from Year 11 and 12 at 5.30pm on Wednesday 24 March in the common room. This should all be revision for Year 12 but the idea is to convey the importance of taking senior studies seriously and some of the more important aspects of assessment and the procedures for N Awards.

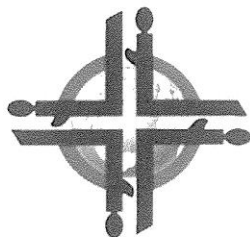
