There are a variety of subject specific competitions, and in addition, several writing, speaking or other types of opportunities which occur from time to time.

The intention is to encourage participation of students in these competitions. With this in mind TCS intends to invite them to enter competitions. We will also subsidise the cost of students entering competitions.

This letter provides opportunities for students to enter competitions. The table shows the Competition Name, when it occurs, who is eligible, the total cost and the subsidised cost. ICAS is run by the University of NSW and stands for *International Competitions and Assessments for Schools*.

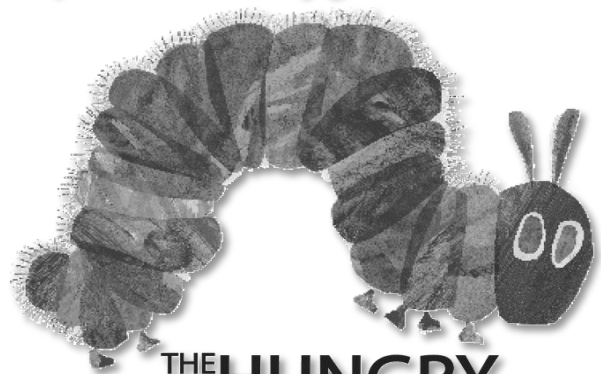

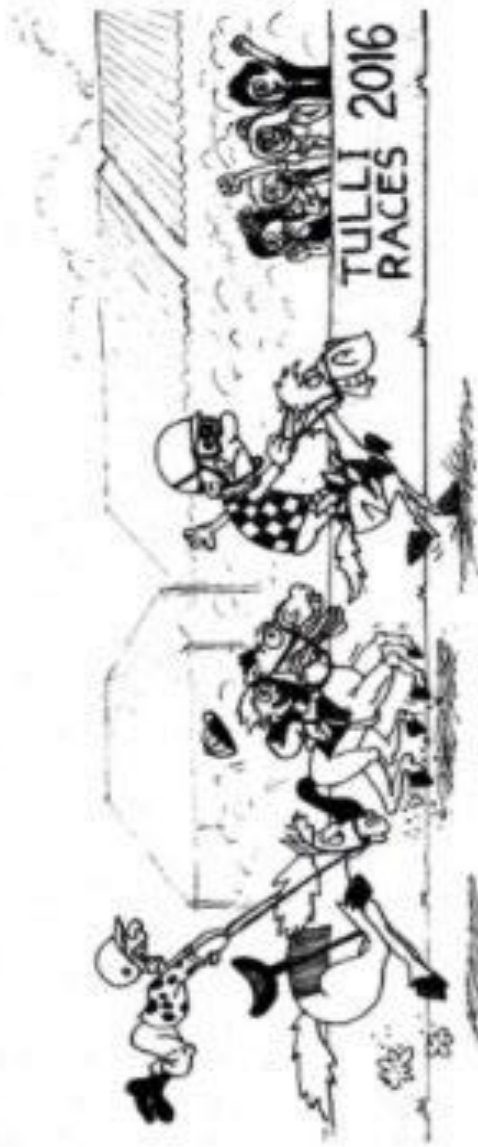
