Students will travel to Condobolin where they will visit Felton Industries and gain an insight into how a business in the metals industry operates.

Entrepreneurship

Our 4 Year 9 students travelled to Parkes yesterday to be part of the new Entrepreneurship course being run in conjunction with Parkes High School and Intel. Whilst there was an information overload yesterday, this course will allow students the opportunity to explore innovative ideas that may lead to potential small businesses. 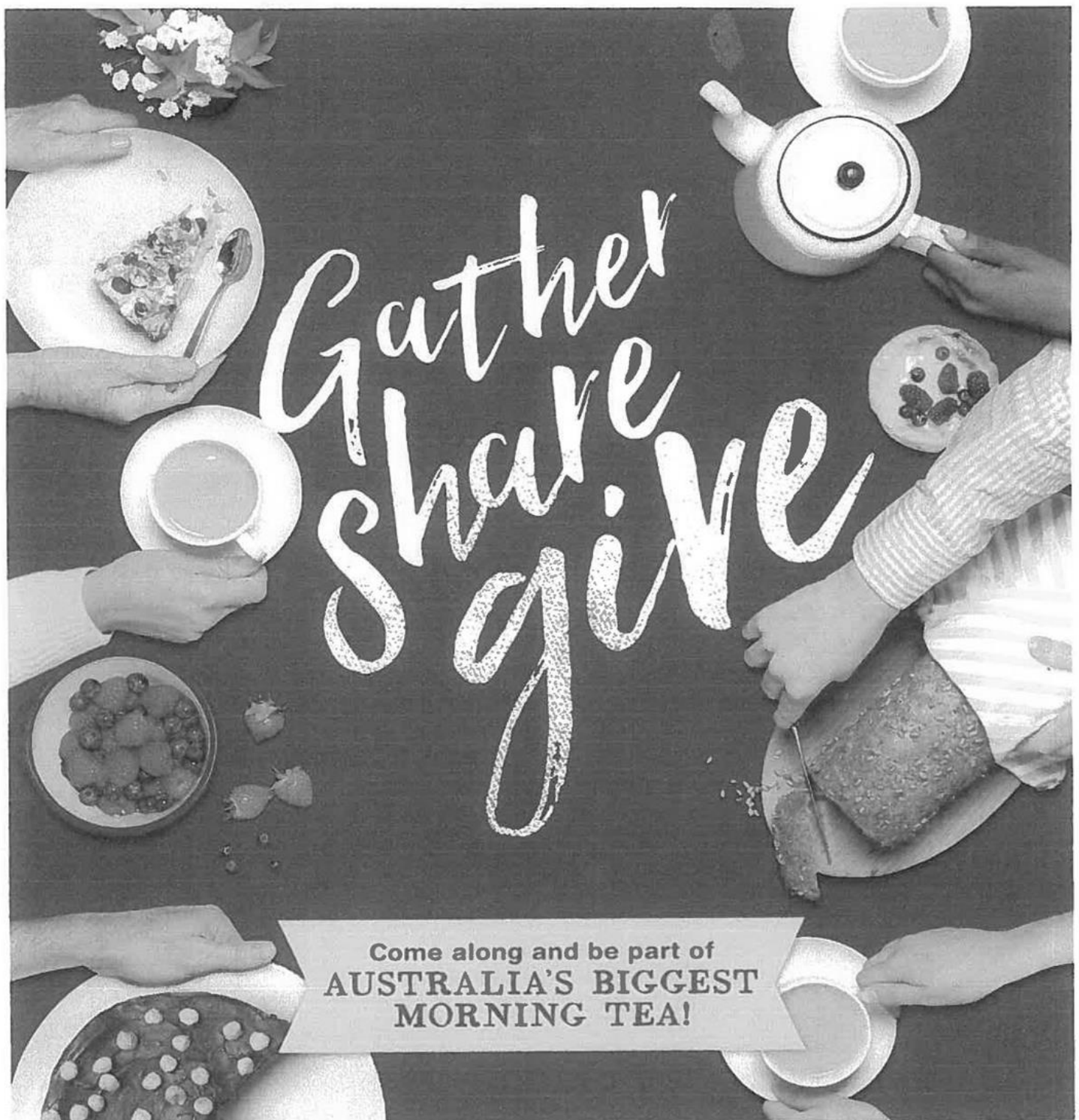
