SCHOOL CAPTAIN'S TRIP TO SYDNEY

On Wednesday the 4th of May, Ricky and Mr West, along with school captains from Ungarie and Lake Cargelligo, flew to Sydney for a tour of NSW Parliament House and Government House. Condobolin also sent their captains who we met in Sydney. We were able to meet our local member of state parliament, Kevin Humphries, member for Barwon as pictured below. Students were able to see both houses of parliament in session from the viewing platforms, as well as seeing a protest in action outside of the building. The afternoon session involved a tour of Government House and a meeting with the Governor of NSW, His Excellency General David Hurley, before flying home.



Stage 5 Geography Salinity excursion to Condobolin/Ootha

On Friday the 6th of May, stage 5 students and Mr West travelled to Condobolin to be involved in a joint excursion with Condobolin High School focused on the issue of salinity. Students were able to see the effect this geographic issue has had on different areas of the town; from buildings in town, to farmland and Gum Bend Lake. This excursion tied in with their study of salinity in the classroom

and provided first hand fieldwork in exploring the issue. Students were given the opportunity to measure the depth of the water table using a piezometer and draw conclusions as to what may have helped or hindered the rise of the water table. Students should now be working towards completing a report on salinity for their next assessment task, using information and photos from the day.



Stage 5 Entrepreneurship excursion to Parkes

On Monday the 9th of May, stage 5 students and Mr West travelled to Parkes to be part of the launch of a new program being run by Intel and the Department of Education which is based around innovation and entrepreneurship. Students were able to hear from those who had been successful entrepreneurs and learn about what skills you need to achieve success. They will be involved in an ongoing program where they need to come up with ideas that are able to solve problems we face in our everyday lives and can be capitalised on.

Term 2 has seen a very busy start at the Ag farm! Both the year 11 Primary Industries and Stage 5 Agriculture students worked together to sow wheat and oats into 3 paddocks before the rain hit us in the end of week 2. This crop will not only be used for grazing by our show team livestock but for our year 11 Agriculture students who will be comparing crop growth with different fertilisers as their major assessment this term.

Stage 5's vegetable gardens have taken off over the holidays and the students have been busily maintaining and mulching; their ownership of their gardens has shown great responsibility and maturity from this group – great job!

We have 4 new additions to our farm – Peanut, Jelly, Splash and Smoky the baby nanny-goats! So far they are settling in well and all students have taken on the responsibility for feeding and looking after them.

Our school's Show Team is starting up and we are very fortunate to have the sponsorship of Rockingham stud who have agreed to lend the school two heifers which will give the students more opportunities during the shows to exhibit the animals. They have also kindly donated a steer and we thank you very much for this contribution. We are hoping our cattle will arrive this term to start breaking them in.

In saying this, I'd like to thank the whole community for all their support at the Ag farm; we are very lucky to have such a helpful community!

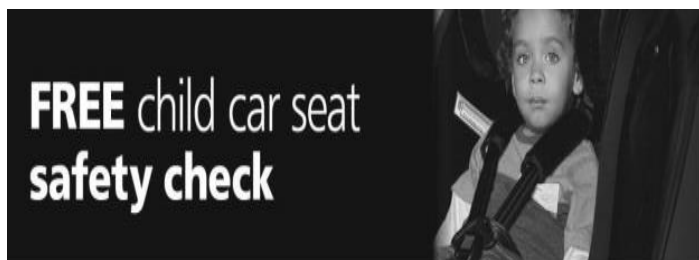

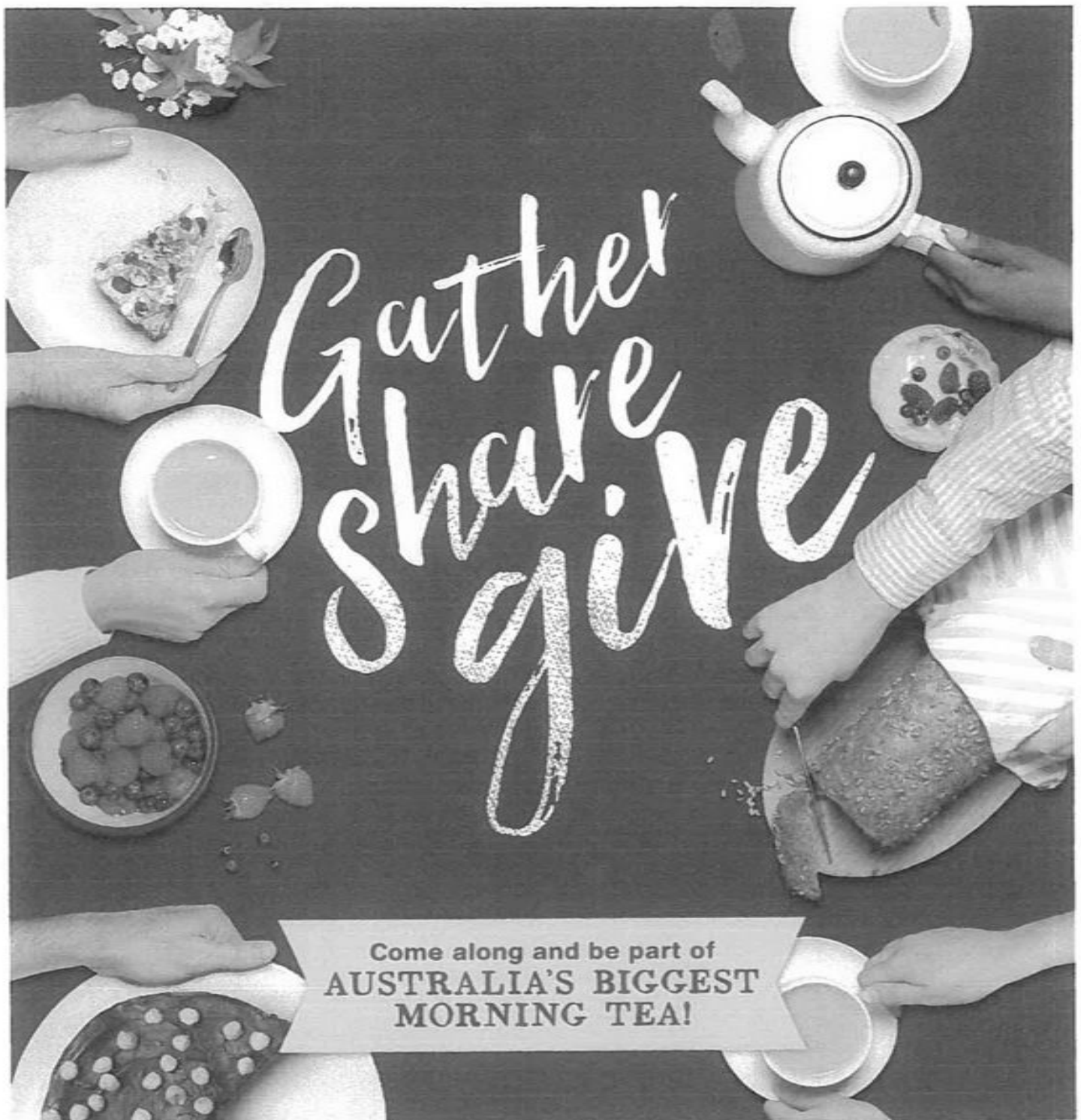
