The dragon was so happy he squealed out loud and his mum even heard him from their own village.





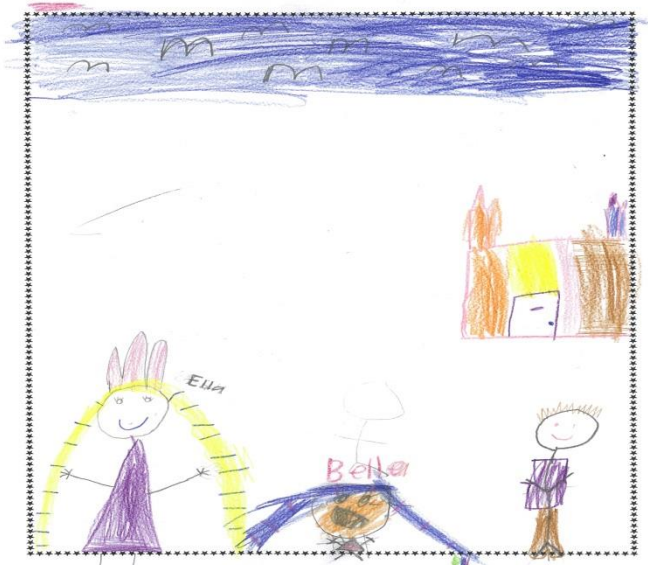


## HERO PRINCESS
