Next week students in Year 3,5,7 and 9 will sit the NAPLAN, this is a state wide test for all students.

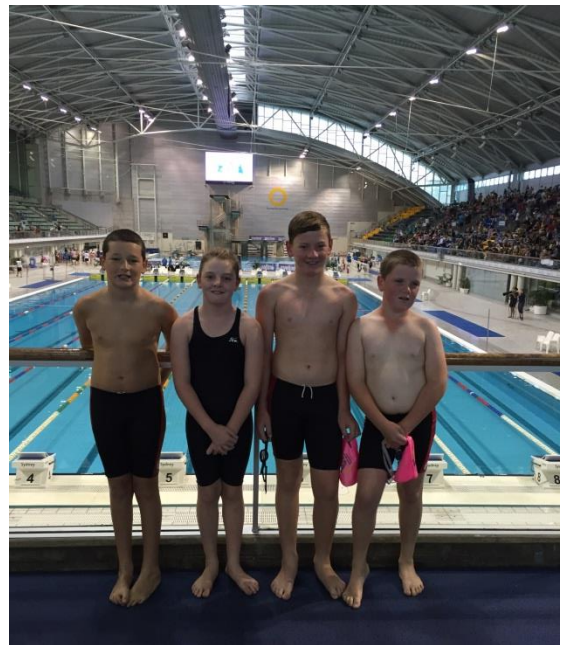
