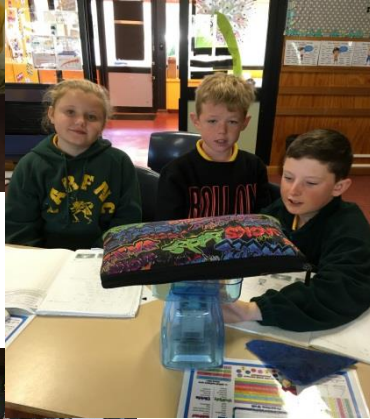

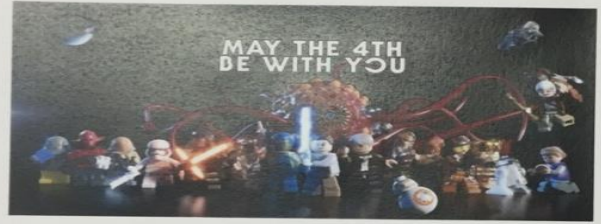


Primary News

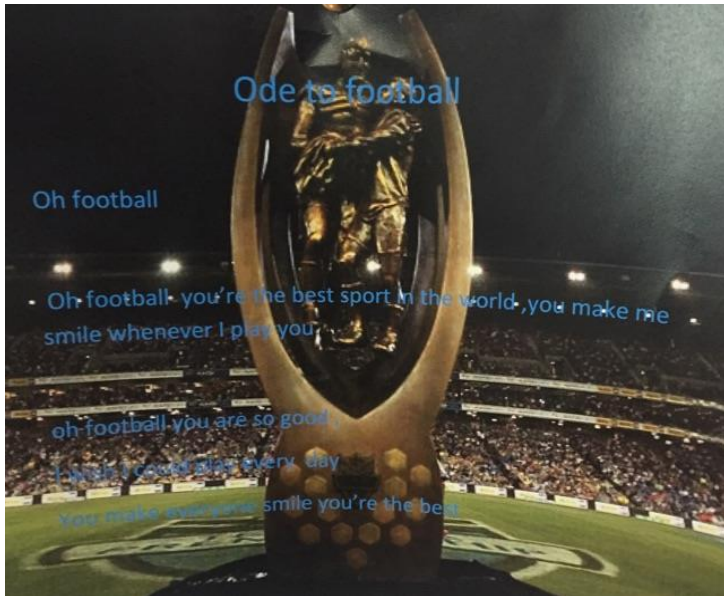

Compulsory School Attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The *Education Act 1990* requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time

- ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- gives students time to greet their friends before class
- reduces classroom disruption.

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance e.g. attending a funeral.

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within **7** days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within **2** days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An *Application for Extended Leave* may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

My child won't go to school. What should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education and may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school.

Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

- **Compulsory Schooling Conferences**

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

- **Application to the Children's Court - Compulsory Schooling Order**

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a *Compulsory Schooling Order*.

The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

- **Prosecution in the Local Court**

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in Partnership

The Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.

Tullibigeal Central School students to enter the following CWA competitions for 2016.

International Competition:

This year we are studying Mongolia. The Primary School Book competition has been updated to a digital power point presentation. The instructions and marking criteria can be found on the cwa website. Go to www.cwaofnsw.org.au and download from the International section at the top of the page. Please remember that identification of students, if more than one on the usb or cd is important, but names should not be included. A **separate** file giving the name, branch, group, age of child and name of school should be included on the memory stick and also on paper accompanying the memory stick. These are due to Tullibigeal CWA **by** 29 July 2016.

Cultural Competition:

Junior Short Story: **The topic is Best Mates**. Open to all children. Only one entry per child. Age Categories - 8-12 years and 13 -18 years.



The story should be up to 500 words only. The child's name, age, branch and group details should **NOT** be on the writing but included on a separate sheet of paper.

Entries are due to Tullibigeal Branch CWA by Monday 8 August 2016, so they can be delivered for judging to the Group Officer at Hillston on Thursday 11 August.

Junior Posters: **The topic is**, A Circus. Open to all children. Only one entry per child. Age Categories - 8 years and under, 9-12 years and 13-18 years. The standard size is A3. Name, branch, group, age of child and school should be written clearly on back of poster.

Posters and Photography will be due to Tullibigeal Branch CWA by Monday 5 September 2016. Judging will take place at Murrumbidgee Lachlan Group Day at Rankins Springs on Thursday 8 September.

Junior Photography: Open to Junior members or relatives of members only.

The topic is Eating Icecream (size 10 X 15 cm) Digital Photos are welcome. Only one entry per child The only restriction is that they must be printed on photographic paper and be the regulation size. (10cm by 15cm) Take a snap on your digital camera, smartphone or IPAD and submit it as long as it is cropped to the correct size and printed on photographic paper. Happy Snapping!

Junior Digital Poster Presentation: **The topic is**, A Circus. Children are welcome to submit both paper and digital sections. Only one entry per child. Presentation is to be on a memory stick. More than one entry is acceptable on the same usb. Age Categories - 8 years and under, 9-12 years and 13-18 years. There should be a *separate* file giving the name, branch, group, age of child and name of school also on the memory stick as well as on paper accompanying the memory stick.

The Digital Poster is due to Tullibigeal Branch CWA by Monday 5 September 2016.

Land Cookery: Entries must be to Tullibigeal CWA by 9am on Melbourne Cup Day 2016.

- 12 Years and under as at 31 March 2017 – Giant Anzac Chewy Biscuit
Four should be presented on a foil tray sealed in a baking bag. The attached recipe **MUST** be used.

Giant Anzac Chewy Biscuits—Section 11, Class B

1 cup plain flour
1 ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 ½ cups plain rolled oats 1 cup desiccated coconut
½ cup caster sugar
¼ cup (firmly packed) brown sugar
125g butter, cubed ¼ cup golden syrup
2 tablespoons water
1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

Method

Preheat oven to 150°C. Line a baking tray with non stick baking paper.

In a medium sized bowl, sift together the flour and cinnamon. Add rolled oats, caster sugar, brown sugar and coconut; mix well.

Combine butter, golden syrup and water in a small saucepan and stir over low-medium heat until the butter melts and the mixture is well combined. Remove from the heat and stir in bicarbonate of soda.

Add immediately to the dry ingredients and use a wooden spoon to stir until well combined.

Roll 2 tablespoons portions of mixture into balls and place on the lined tray about 5cm apart. Use your fingers to flatten each slightly (until they are about 1cm thick) and bake in the preheated oven for 16 minutes.

Remove from the oven and set aside for 5 minutes to cool slightly before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

- 18 Years and under as at 31 March 2017 – Chocolate Hazelnut Friands
Six are to be presented on a foil tray sealed in a baking bag. The attached recipe **MUST** be used.

Chocolate Hazelnut Friands—Section 11, Class A

100g butter
100g packet ground hazelnut meal
1 ½ cups icing sugar, sifted
½ cup plain flour, sifted
5 egg whites
¼ cup chocolate hazelnut spread

Method

Preheat oven to 180°C. Lightly grease a friand tray (approx 7cm x 3-4cm high)

Melt butter in a medium saucepan over low heat, cook gently for 10 minutes until golden. Cool. Place ground hazelnut meal, sugar and flour in a mixing bowl; stir well to combine. Add egg whites, hazelnut spread and browned butter, mix well to combine. Divide mixture equally between holes in the prepared pan. Bake for 20-25 minutes until friands are cooked.

Cool on a towel covered wire rack.

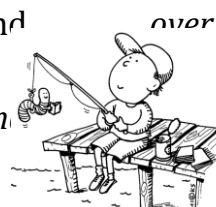
