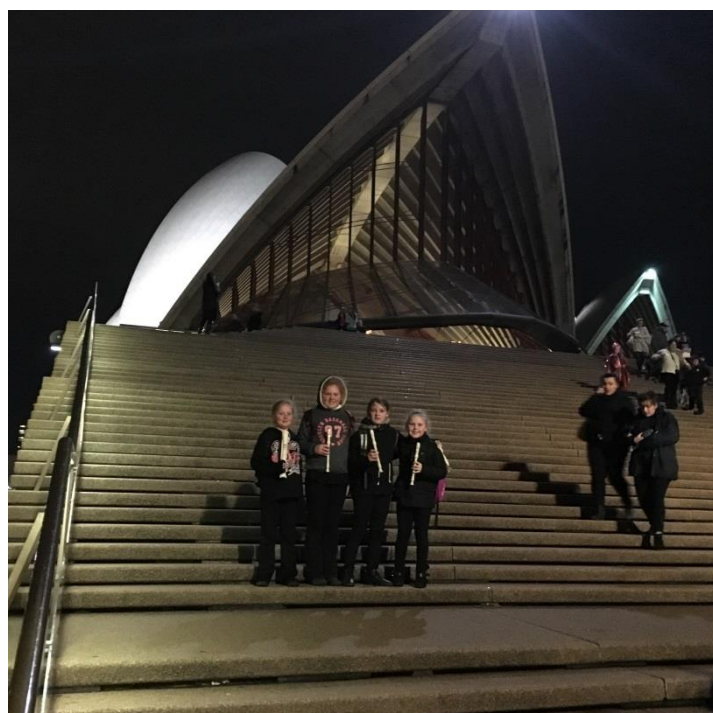

Bedgerebong Show

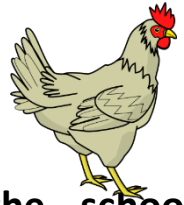

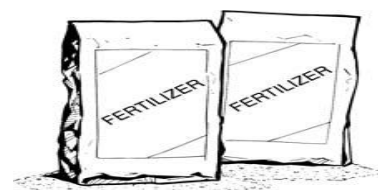
