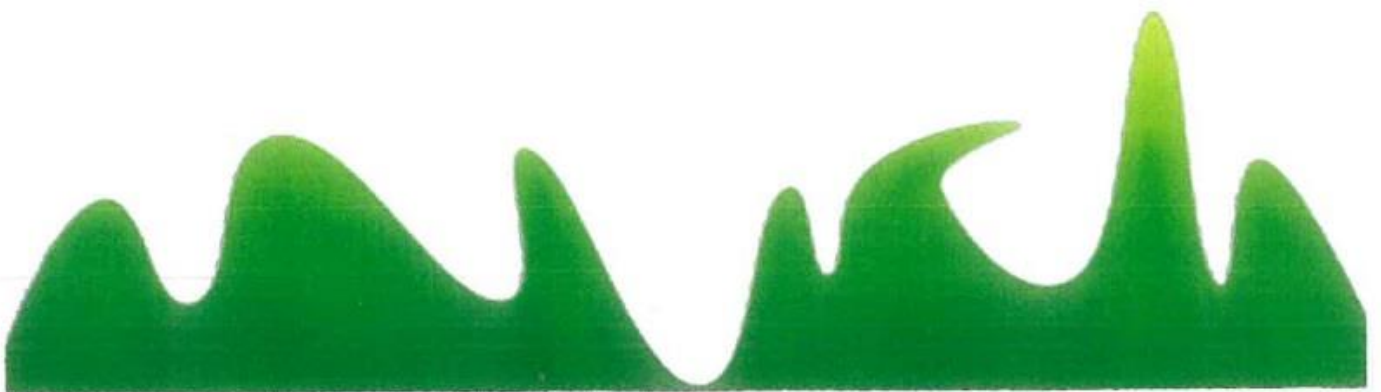

## TULLIBIGEAL BRANCH

On Friday 29 July the Tullibigeal Branch of CWA held its annual International Day.



It was capably run by our International Officer, Kerry. A trading table was loaded with fresh fruit, eggs, cooking and plants. A terrific display by Tullibigeal School children adorned the CWA room walls and the children attended to show us their power point presentations, which will go on to Group judging, and they sang for us.

State International Officer, Joy Granger, told us about the work of ACWW. On the day, \$63 was raised for this work. Often these difficulties are labelled as misbehaviour, being “naughty”, or just not being able to concentrate.
