In NSW there are thousands of Informal School Bus Stops, particularly in rural and regional areas.

Informal School Bus Stops are not signed, posted or developed as formal bus stop. Unlike formal bus stops, Informal School Bus Stops are often agreed between bus operators and families. Following a student fatality Transport for NSW has developed advice for selecting and reviewing informal bus stops.

A key Bus Safety message for all students is to:

Wait till the bus has gone and then use a safe place to cross the road.

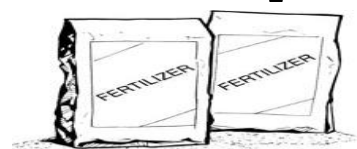

NSW Quad Bike Safety Improvement Program

The NSW Quad Bike Safety Improvement Program is offering 4 rebates that will give eligible farmers and their workers up to \$500 to implement harm prevention measures in the workplace. This program is funded by SafeWork NSW.

The rebate package will be rolled out across NSW from 19 July 2016 – 30 June 2017. If rebate numbers are exhausted prior to 30 June 2017, the package will close early.

Below is a list of the eligible safety solutions on offer as part of this rebate package:

- Up to \$310 toward the cost of quad bike training. To qualify, the participant need to provided prove attendance and completion of the Unit of Competency (UOC) AHCMOM212– Operate quad bikes delivered by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) in NSW.
- Up to \$250 towards the purchase of either the Quadbar™ Operator Protective Device (OPD) or ATV Lifeguard OPD.
- Up to \$500 to purchase a side-by-side vehicle.
- Up to \$45 to purchase a helmet compliant with NZS 8600:2002, AS/NZS 1698:2006 and/or UNECE22.05.

A business can access the rebate for a combination of the abovementioned eligible safety solution up to \$500, however one business can only access the rebate once.

Workers of eligible business may access the rebate program for a maximum of 1 helmet and 1 training per application.

How do I access the rebates?

Step 1: Confirm eligibility. Click [here](#) to check your eligibility.

Step 2: Pre-register interest in rebates (optional) Applicants who pre-register will have 60 days to submit their final application from pre-registration date. Pre-registering will guarantee that applicants will receive the rebate funds (once eligibility is confirmed) and avoid the potential of rebate funds running out prior to your application being processed.

Step 3: Attend [eligible educative interaction](#) sponsored by SafeWork NSW.

Step 4: Purchase eligible items and obtain paid tax invoice

Step 5: Complete application form. Click [here](#) to access the online application form.

Step 6: Submit application to NSW Farmers Association within 4 months of attending an eligible educative interaction or prior to 30 June 2017, whichever comes first.
