From the School,

What a cold and wet week we had last week; it was nice to see the sun out yesterday. As a result of the very wet weather last week the Lower Lachlan Athletics Carnival has been postponed as a result of the grounds in West Wyalong being closed. Hopefully, we will have a new date shortly.

This week is Education Week, with the theme of "Lifelong Learners". Next week we will celebrate Education week assembly which will be livestreamed via our Facebook page. Unfortunately, with the current COVID-19 restrictions we are unable to have parents and community members attend our school. More information about the assembly will come later in the week.



This week our 7 transition students will begin their educational journey at our school and I am sure they will enjoy their time here over the next two terms. I look forward to welcoming them all and showing them around our school on Wednesday. Mrs Rossiter and Mrs Helyar have been busy preparing some fantastic lessons for our new students.

Last week Kindergarten to Year 6 had Chris Hanneman visit for a skills session for NRL. It was great seeing all the students enjoying the session outside my window on the new lawn area. Thank you Chris for attending our school.

Late yesterday we were informed that the Festival of Instrumental Music performance which was to be held in Sydney has been cancelled due to the current situation. This decision has been made to ensure the safety and wellbeing of students and staff, and taking into consideration the viability of the event proceeding in a COVID-safe way.

Every Department of Education school has a number of targets, including an attendance target relating to the percentage of students attending school 90% of the time and above. As a reminder I'm sharing the following number of days students can be absent from school for the percentage attendance shown:

| - 95% attendance - 10 days per year | - 90% attendance - 20 days per year |
| - 85% attendance - 30 days per year | - 80% attendance - 40 days per year |

You may think that 85% attendance is ok. However students who have an attendance rate of 85% are missing 6 weeks of school per year which is over half a term. If a student had an attendance rate of 85% across their whole schooling, they would miss 78 weeks of school, which is almost two years. We are regularly looking at our attendance data to identify those students who are educationally at risk due to low attendance at school. The research tells us that students with an attendance rate below 90% are educationally at risk. Above 95% is our expected student attendance. We are currently reviewing our attendance procedures and will be putting a number of processes in place over the remainder of the year. We understand that at the moment students are encouraged to stay at home if unwell, however there are still a number of students who are absent for unjustified reasons. Please work with us to ensure all students are at school to give them the best chance of success in life.

Don't forget next Monday will be our school photo day. We ask that students wear full school uniform. Could all students wear their gold school shirt and either green/grey pants or skirts. We look forward to seeing everyone looking their best on Monday.

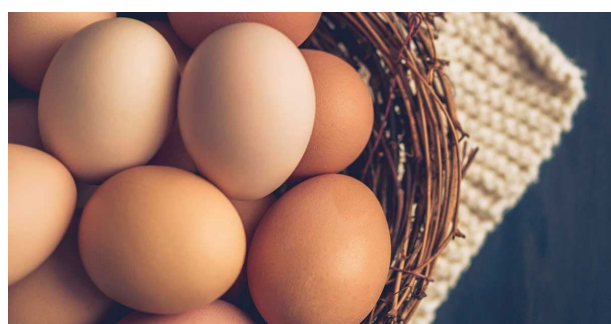

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 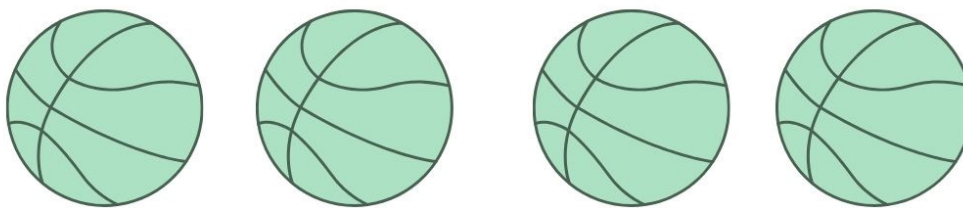
